While we had this big vision in our minds to impact 10,000 young professionals through the CMP, we started small.

For our first batch, we had only six mentors and eight mentees. Yes, it was a small number but it was all we needed to show the role mentorship can play in transforming the African communications industry.



Four years, six batches, 250 mentees and 150 mentors later, we've had the privilege of seeing the personal and professional lives of mentees improve just from being supported and guided by a senior professional. And for the senior professionals, we've also seen the sense of fulfilment they have derived from serving as mentors and pouring out what they know.


I wholeheartedly recommend the Comms Mentorship Programme as it has been significant in shaping my career over the last year and a half.

I loved the fact that she was open and showed me the ropes in terms of professional advancement. I got to ask the personal questions I had about professional growth.

The weekly workshops were more like the icing on the cake for me. So, aside from being tutored by a mentor, you also get to hear what other professionals/mentors have to say and learn from their experiences.

I loved the fact that they were open. Nobody came to say they had it all rosy. They were also at a stage where they didn't have everything figured out. Then, lastly, the opportunity to do a thoughtful professional assessment. I wrote down the skills I had and areas I needed improvement.

I put down goals and carefully thought about what I wanted out of my comms journey. This process was like a wake-up call for me, and it gave me more perspective into what I wanted.

5. Stay humble and learn from them. Mentees have a lot of insights to share. Your ability to connect with them in humility will help them to discover their potential and manifest greatness beyond their imagination.

6. Family can be built from simple mentor and mentee relationships. The people I am privileged to mentor – Ayomide and Festus, have become family. We still maintain our WhatsApp group for check-ins at intervals and I ensure to meet them in person anytime I am in Abuja. We have met in person about three times in Abuja.

I had a great experience and it was truly a blessing to be able to share in such a safe and structured space. My mentee and I are still in communication today.


I share opportunities with her, and she comes back to me with questions every now and then. I'm truly rooting for her.




